


VISITORS DISCOVER THE BEAUTY OF CASA DE LUZ

Trans, lesbian, gay & bisexual people are fleeing from all over the world to escape "epidemic levels of violence" and threats by criminal gangs and security forces. Over 2,900 were killed in the past 5 years just in Central America. These are the most vulnerable refugees entering the US.
